EXPECTATIONS OF BOARD FELLOWS

- Serve a one year term: August through June
- Attend a minimum of three board meetings a year and join a Committee

- Have access to reliable transportation/reliable internet to join virtual meetings
- Invite peers to attend/join Council offerings
- Provide a reflective learning statement/assessment at the end of the term

- Fulltime undergraduate student

- **Current resume (1 page)**
- **Letter of recommendation:** from an academic contact and one or from a professional, community, or extracurricular activities contact
- **Proof of a 3.0+ GPA** (unofficial transcript will suffice)
- **Motivational Essay (1 page)** explaining why you would like to be considered for this fellowship.

- Academic interest in nonprofit work
- Extracurricular service activities
- Leadership qualities and potential
- Career aspirations
- Other qualities that demonstrate you are an exceptional candidate and would make a great addition to Board Fellows Program
