Academic WorldQuest is a Flagship Program of the World Affairs Council network across the U.S. The World Affairs Council of Jacksonville began its own Academic WorldQuest in 2005. This competition has grown to include 24 First Coast high schools and 58 teams.



How does Academic WorldQuest Work? Teams consist of four students and up to three teams from each high school may participate. There are six rounds of six questions each. All of the questions are multiple choice, and students use clickers to input their answer.



This year's categories include:

Atrocity Prevention and Accountability • Battle of the Century: Autocracy vs. Democracy • Economic Sanctions - A Double-Edged Sword • Great Decisions • The Arctic Council: Frozen Cooperation • The Future of Supply Chains



The top scoring team will then represent Northeast Florida in the national competition that takes place in Washington, D.C. in the spring! The team with the most creative team name and each of the three highest scoring teams are recognized. "Taipei Personality" from Samuel Wolfson School for Advanced Studies was awarded the most creative team name in last year's competition.
